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BUILD YOUR OWN READING ROCKET!

- STEP 1:** Cut out all six pieces on the next page with scissors: one full rocket, two half rockets, two big disks, one small disk.
- STEP 2:** On the whole rocket, cut along the three dotted lines, two on one side and one on the other. Do not cut all the way across the rocket.
- STEP 3:** On the two half rockets, cut along the three dotted lines. Do not cut all the way across.
- STEP 4:** Cut along the three dotted lines on each of the three round disks.
- STEP 5:** Take one of the big disks and, holding it flat like a plate, fit the long middle cut into the matching one on the bottom of the whole rocket (closest to the legs). Then do the same for the other big disk, putting it into the middle cut on the whole rocket. Match the long middle cut on the small disk to the cut nearest the top of the whole rocket.
- STEP 6:** Take one half rocket and slide its cuts into those on one side of the disks so it makes a T shape with the other rocket. The three cuts in the half rocket should line up with the ones on the three disks.
- STEP 7:** Take the other half rocket and line up its cuts with the three cuts on the other side of the disks. The whole rocket will be between the two. Connect this half rocket with the disks.
