- ✓ In a parking lot
- ✓ On a multiple lane roadway
- ✓ On the opposite side of a divided highway

PENALTIES FOR PASSING A SCHOOL BUS

Penalties for passing a school bus can include a fine, 5+ points on your license, possible imprisonment, and, worst of all, the lifetime trauma of hitting or killing a child.

Conviction	Fine	Possible Imprisonment
1 st Offense	\$250-\$400	Up to 30 days
2 nd Offense	\$600-\$750	Up to 180 days
3 rd Offense	\$750-\$1,000	Up to 180 days

WHAT IS “OPERATION SAFE STOP”?

It is illegal and extremely dangerous to pass a stopped school bus when the large red lights located on top of the bus are flashing. Even on divided, multilane highways or school grounds, drivers must stop for flashing red lights.

Operation Safe Stop seeks to promote bus safety through education and enforcement efforts.
